INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the 2026/2027 edition of the Durston House Future Schools Information Guide for Parents. This document is updated annually in time for the Year 3 and 4 Future Schools Meeting.

We are here to help and to provide advice and support in choosing the right senior school for your child and in helping navigate the admissions process for their next school. To help in this process, please do keep us informed of the schools for which you have registered or from which you have withdrawn; and let us know dates of school interviews so that we can plan interview practice in preparation for the event. *It is also worth noting that registering your child for senior school is the responsibility of the parent rather than the Prep School. The reason being that payment of a registration fee to the senior school is involved.*

Mrs Ferns, my PA and Registrar, keeps our Future Schools spreadsheets up to date, and this greatly assists in managing the process. Mrs Saigau (Assistant Head Academic) is also on hand to help with the admission process, and to provide further advice and guidance. We meet regularly to review our future schools information, and I am readily available to meet with you to discuss options and progress.

Selecting a senior school and managing the application process varies between schools and the age at which you are looking for entry. By working together in managing the application process, we can work towards ensuring that the right choices are made and that the preparation and process have been thorough.

We hope this guide will provide a useful reference for you to the senior schools that you may be considering for your child/children, including website information, admissions contacts, deadlines for registration and open day information.

Boarding Schools

Bedales Senior: Co-ed boarding – Entry at 13+ is via their own 2-day residential assessments in the January of Year 6. Children are advised to be registered three years before entry at 13.

Bloxham: Co-educational full and flexible boarding, and day, entry at 11+, 13+ and 16+. Scholarships available at 11+, 13+ and 16+. Entry for 13+: A combination of a child's CAT4 or MidYIS score (provided by their current school), school reference and assessment morning performance will be used to determine who is offered a place. Registered candidates attend an assessment morning in Year 6 for an interview, group exercise, and a 20-minute writing test. This test assesses writing fluidity, language use, and spelling and grammar through a response to stimulus material.

Charterhouse: Boarding and day for boys and girls aged 13 to 18. Children should be registered by 30 September of Year 6, and will sit the online ISEB Common Pre-Test at Durston House in the Autumn Term of Year 6. Results are reviewed in conjunction with a reference from the Head. Successful applicants are then invited to spend an afternoon at Charterhouse in the Spring Term when they will be interviewed and will take part in other activities that will give them the chance to show their capabilities and to experience a taste of life at Charterhouse. Places will be offered at the end of the Spring Term of Year 6. Families who accept places will be invited to visit the Head of House with their child during Year 7 and to express their preferences. The children will continue to work towards the Common Entrance at 13+, which we expect them to pass comfortably.

Dulwich College: Each academic year around 90 boys join the Middle School into Year 9 (age 13). In addition, 130 boys join the year group from our Lower School, as well as 10 boarders, making a total of around 230 boys. 60 of these places are given to boys who sit an entrance examination at Dulwich College when they are in Year 6. The remaining 30 places are given to boys who sit an examination when they are in Year 8.

Epsom College: Entry to the Third Form (Year 7) or Middle Fourth (Year 9) should register by the 31 October in Year 6. Applicants are assessed by way of the ISEB Common Pre-Test assessment which comprises papers in English, Mathematics, Verbal and Non-Verbal Reasoning. The assessment takes place in the Autumn Term of Year 6 and is usually held at a candidate's current school. Candidates will be selected to attend an Engagement Day; a half-day session at the College held in the January of Year 6. This enables candidates to discover what Epsom is all about and for the College to spend some time getting to know each child. None of the work is marked or assessed, we're simply looking out for their engagement, attitude, friendliness and personality.

Eton College: Boys, all boarding for school years 9 – 13.

Registrations can be made any time up to **31 August** at the end of UK school year 5. This is a strict deadline and cannot be extended. All parents must complete a Financial Declaration form which forms part of the Admissions process to confirm if full fees can be afforded or if financial assistance is required. The deadline for submission of the Financial Declaration form is **30 September** at the beginning of UK school year 6.

Admissions assessment

First Stage: Registered boys sit the ISEB online Pre-tests in September, October or November of Year 6 and their current school submits a detailed report for review.

Second Stage: Boys who are successful at the first stage are invited to Eton in the Spring or early Summer term of year 6 for an assessment consisting of an online reasoning test and individual interview. The date of the assessment depends on either their date of birth or whether they need a significant bursary of over 80%.

Bursary application process

Boys who require a significant bursary (over 80%) will be required to complete a full bursary form by the middle of January (exact date will be provided in correspondence). All other bursary candidates will be required to submit a full bursary form at the same time as they are invited for the 2nd stage assessment.

Boys will receive one of the following; a conditional offer, an offer of a place on the waiting list, or no offer. Boys who are on the wait list will be reassessed in the Summer term of year 7. For bursary candidates, any offer letter will contain information confirming the level of the bursary award offered. It is not possible for boys who are waitlisted to receive a bursary award should they be promoted, due to limited funds available.

Boys sit exams for setting purposes and to confirm their conditional offers in Year 8. For boys in independent schools, these exams will either be CE (Common Entrance) or KS (the King's Scholarship). It is very rare that a boy will not confirm his place through the exams. Eton does not provide a fixed pass rate for CE, but around a 65% overall level is usually expected. All candidates for CE are expected to sit the following papers; core English, core plus Additional Maths, core Science and level 2 modern language (French, German or Spanish). Boys at schools following the CE syllabus for these subjects are also expected to sit Latin (usually level 2 or 3), History, Geography and/or TPR, with Greek and Classical Civilisation further optional papers. If boys are in a UK state school they will be expected to sit the Eton Entrance Exams (aligned with the state school curriculum) or the KS as their entrance exam in UK school year 8.

13+ Music Awards and the King's Scholarship are run on a yearly basis and are open to all boys of the right age, to find the outstanding musicians and academics in competition. Applications for the next year of entry will be available on the website by the autumn term before entry (Year 8), up to the relevant deadline - Scholarships and Awards - Eton College.

We run regular admissions tours throughout the academic year. If parents would like to visit, we ask that they contact us directly (admissions@etoncollege.org.uk or by telephoning: 01753 370611).

Harrow School: Each year, Harrow admits around 160 boys into Year 9. Pupils looking at Harrow should ideally register by 1 July of Year 5. The absolute deadline is 1 January of Year 7 (boys who register between 1 July of Year 5 and 1 January of Year 7 will be considered ‘late applicants’ and will need to be particularly strong as they will be competing for fewer places). The online ISEB Common Pre-Test takes place at prep schools, ideally between 1 September and 22 November of Year 6. Boys who pass the ISEB Common Pre-Test will sit the Harrow Test in January/February of Year 6. Offers of places are sent out in April of Year 6. The School welcomes applications from bright, enthusiastic boys with extra-curricular interests who like the thought of living in a community of other boys, and who would ultimately thrive in a full boarding environment and make full use of all the facilities and opportunities available. We recommend that prospective applicants and their parents/guardians attend an Open Morning when the applicant is in Year 4 or above.

Open Mornings run from 9am until 1pm and we recommend that families visit the School when boys are in Years 4 or 5. The morning will feature a talk from the Headmaster, and a Q&A from the Director of Studies and some of our boys. Please note that the tour involves steep hills and steps and is therefore not suitable for prams, pushchairs, very young children or people who are not physically robust. Marlborough College: Co-educational, full boarding school with entry at 13+ and 16+. Enquiries are welcomed at any stage and registration is open from 1st September, 5 years prior to entry.

We advise you to register by the end of Year 5 if you wish your child to take part in our assessment process in Year 6, as we will be in contact with all our registered families over the summer holidays to provide further information. A non-refundable Registration fee of £360 (including VAT) is payable at registration stage.

There is an entry assessment process for candidates that wish to apply in Year 7 but approximately 75% of places are awarded to candidates who apply in Year 6. The College has its own entry assessment, which consists of the feeder school's reference, the ISEB pre-test and two interviews held on an assessment day at the College. Approximately 60% is based on the Head's reference and the ISEB test and 40% on the assessment day. Following the assessment, unconditional places are then offered in the following March/April. Children who are offered a firm place will be expected to take the Common Entrance examinations in the June prior to entry in September. The results from this are used for setting purposes only and will not affect the child's place at the College.

Shiplake College: A co-educational day and boarding school situated on the banks of the River Thames in rural Oxfordshire, near Henley-on-Thames. Usual entry points are ages 11, 13 and Sixth Form. We currently admit up to 40 pupils into Year 9 each September. Year 9 assessments are in the autumn of a candidate's Year 7 (or Year 8 for late applicants). Assessment days take place on site and consist of written papers, group work activities, sport and an informal interview, allowing us to get to know applicants and their 'fit'. References from current schools are also taken into account. Although a selective school, selection is not made on academic ability alone. Our holistic approach to admissions assessments allows the school to make truly informed decisions and any offers made are usually unconditional. Those taking Common Entrance examinations are encouraged to work hard but candidate's own school will mark the papers. Out-of-process admissions take place if the school has space. Prospective parents are welcome to come and have a look around, either at a formal open event, Headmaster's Lunch or by individual visit. Taster days are offered in the summer term of Year 6.

We advise families to register their children no later than Year 5 in order to complete the three stages of our Admissions process: • ISEB Common Pre-Tests taken in Year 6. Overseas pupils, for whom English is not their first language will be required to sit an UKiset test. All prospective pupils are required to visit the School in Year 6 for an interview with the Registrar and a Houseparent, a tour of a House and of the School. Confidential references will be requested when prospective pupils are in Year 6. On completion of the three key elements of the Admissions process, a decision about whether to offer your child a place will be made. Successful candidates will receive an unconditional offer. We offer a number of Open Mornings throughout the year designed to provide you with a flavour of Stowe and recommend attending when your child is in Year 4 or 5.

Wellington College: Co-educational boarding and day. Every year, around 200 new pupils join Wellington in Third Form (Year 9) at 13+ and a small number enter Fourth Form (Year 10) at 14+. Our selection process for 13+ entry is in two stages: children sit the ISEB Common Pre-Test in either Year 6 or 7 and on the basis of their results and the strength of their head teacher's reference they are invited to spend half a day at Wellington. Each year about 500 children will come to one of these selection days, where they get the chance to see what Wellington lessons are all about. No more tests or exams, the children will take part in mock-lessons and group problem solving activities that are all fun and exciting — and which give them the chance to show us what they are really like.

Winchester College: “Winchester College is a boarding school for boys in Years 9 – 13. The Sixth Form welcomes girls and boys as day pupils and is preparing for the entry of girls as boarders when construction of two new boarding houses is complete in September 2026.

Applications are welcome from boys in Year 4 and Year 5 and must be completed by 3 July in Year 5. Parents and boys in Year 5 are encouraged to visit the school via one of the regular Registrar's Tours or Open Days.

All registered pupils sit the ISEB Common Pre-Test in October or November of Year 6. If successful, they will be interviewed in the Spring Term of Year 6 by either the Housemaster with whom they are registered or a senior member of staff. At this stage, offers will be made for entry in two years' time. These offers are made on the basis of the interview and school reports. Offers are conditional on a satisfactory performance in the Entrance Examinations in Year 8 and suitability for boarding. Winchester sets its own Entrance Examination, which is similar in form and syllabus to Common Entrance. Boys take the examination at their own schools in April of Year 8.

Haberdashers' Aske's: Boys day. There are approximately 1,100 boys aged 11 to 18 in the Senior School. Boys join the Senior School either in Year 7 (11+) or Year 9 (13+) or Sixth Form (16+). We also offer 11+ deferred entry. Entry for boys aged 13 and below the age of 14 on 1 September in the year of entry, the first assessment takes place before the Christmas break. Candidates take an entrance examination, which will take place on the School premises, consisting of written papers in English, Mathematics, Science (Chemistry, Physics and Biology), General Humanities (this is a source-based not a syllabus-based paper). Following the assessment, a number of boys are called forward for interview on the basis of their performance in the written examinations and, amongst these boys, offers of places are subsequently made.
